FULTON COUNTY SCHOOLS' DISTRICT GOALS FOR 2023 - 2024

- Increase the graduation rate by 2.5% from summer 2023 to summer 2024.
- Increase the percentage of students meeting grade-level expectations on the Reading/Language Arts Georgia Milestones Assessment by 3% from summer 2023 to summer 2024.

HAPEVILLE CHARTER CAREER ACADEMY SCHOOLWIDE GOALS FOR 2023-2024

- **GOAL 1:** Overall student performance will increase by 3% in math proficiency on Georgia Milestones EOG (End of Grade), and 75% of 6-8 grade students will show at least 40% progress toward typical annual growth as measured by the mid-year Math diagnostic on iReady.
- GOAL 2: Overall student performance will increase by 3% in the English Language Arts (ELA) portion of Georgia Milestones EOG (End of Grade), and 75% of 6-8 grades will show at least 50% progress toward typical annual growth measured by the mid-year Reading diagnostic in iReady.
